BACKGROUND:

Chandradip Development Society -CDS is a woman headed community development organization working since 2000 in the southern coastal belt region focusing disadvantaged community empowerment on social rights and service issues with special attention to women and children. CDS has been registered with the Department of Social Welfare, NGO Affairs Bureau, Jubo Unnayan Adhidaptar (Department of Youth Development) & Women Affairs Bureau. The Head Office of the organization located in Barisal, the southern divisional city of Bangladesh. In 2000 CDS started its development initiative with a program for disadvantaged women empowerment through promoting their rights, leadership and upgrading their situation by IGAs with an Institution Capacity Building Project supported by Southern NGO Network-SNN under Leading Organization BDS, Barisal. At present Chandradip Development Society -CDS is directly implementing projects on Maternal, Child Health & Nutrition; Safe Water Supply & Sanitation; Combating Violence against Women & Girls; Preserving Rights for Women & Children; Legal Aid Support and Education; Literacy Education for the Underprivileged; Food Security, Safety Net & Social Protection; Hazardous Child Labor Elimination & Rehabilitation; Youth Empowerment & Adolescent; Health Rights Establishment Advocacy; Strengthening Local Government Institutions; Climate Change Adaptation & DRM; Establishing Agricultural Rights of the Women Farmers; HIV/AIDS Prevention among Young Generation; National Level Advocacy & Campaign, Humanitarian Capacity Building Program in 18 upazilas of Barisal and Bhola, Districts under Barisal Division supported by different international and national funding partners. 1.2 Project Title:

Multi vitamin for Pregnant and Lactating Mother & for Children

Under partnership with Poverty Eradication Program –PEP, Bangladesh, CDS has been implementing this project from October 2016 under 1st agreement. Under the project necessary medicines of multi-vitamin, vitamin, vitamin A capsule and anti-worm tablets provided among the targeted beneficiaries at free of cost. The medicines come from directly mother organization, Vitamin Angels, USA. These medicines given and fed by trained staffs and volunteers of the organization with required guidelines or instructions. Organization provides volunteer service in implementing this project.
